Salt Lake Community College is offering a "Concurrent Enrollment Transition Tuition Waiver". Students must have completed at least 6 credit hours (two concurrent classes) and have a GPA of 2.0 or better in those classes. Students who register for 6-8 credits their first semester after high school graduation will automatically receive a \$1,000 scholarship for their first two semesters at SLCC, students who register for 9-11 credits will receive \$1,250, and students who register for 12 or more credits will receive \$1500.

All students will need to decide whether or not to order their AP exams by <u>Nov 15, 2025</u>. All students who register for their AP exam after <u>Nov 15, 2025</u>, will be assessed \$40.00 exam late fee. In addition, a \$40.00 exam cancellation fee will be assessed for any exam order canceled after <u>Nov 15, 2025</u>. The absolute final deadline to order an exam is March 15, 2026.
