Salt Lake Community College is offering a “Concurrent Enrollment Transition Tuition Waiver”. Students must have completed at least 6 credit hours (two concurrent classes) and have a GPA of 2.0 or better in those classes. Students who register for 6-8 credits their first semester after high school graduation will automatically receive a \$1,000 scholarship for their first two semesters at SLCC, students who register for 9-11 credits will receive \$1,250, and students who register for 12 or more credits will receive \$1500.

All students will need to decide whether or not to order their AP exams by Nov 15, 2025. All students who register for their AP exam after Nov 15, 2025, will be assessed **\$40.00** exam late fee. In addition, a **\$40.00** exam cancellation fee will be assessed for any exam order canceled after Nov 15, 2025. The absolute final deadline to order an exam is March 15, 2026.


