

DISTRICT SCHOLARSHIPS

The Canyons Education Foundation has five scholarships available for graduating seniors. Due date for this scholarship is **February 28, 2025.** All others have a later due date, but the CANYONS STRONG scholarship will be awarded in early March and recipients recognized at our Gala on March 27.

- Canyons Strong Canyons Education Foundation Scholarship \$2,500
 - The Canyons Strong Scholarship seeks to reward a senior from each high school in the district who has financial need and has shown improvement or exemplary effort in working toward the goal of post-secondary education. We are looking for seniors that have "risen" above difficult circumstances either in family life, financially, emotionally, scholastically, etc. and are still dedicating themselves to furthering their education.
 - Canyons Strong Scholarship award is a total of \$2,500 (\$1,000 for the first year and \$1,500 for the second year). A two-year scholarship provides incentive and encourages students to continue their education.

Aspiring Canyons Educator – ACE / \$5,000

- The Canyons School District Aspiring Educator Scholarship is open to any graduating Canyons School District student who will be enrolled in a University Educator Preparation program that leads to initial licensure as an elementary, secondary, or special education teacher.
- The scholarship may be used for tuition fees, study materials, and/or related school expenses. Scholarship amounts are determined by available funds, field of study, and critical needs areas.
- The scholarship may be awarded for up to four years, but the recipient must reapply and continue to meet all criteria each year.

DISTRICT SCHOLARSHIPS

Mont & Kristine Millerberg Scholarship / \$2,000 per year

GREGORY B. BRANDT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP



Purpose: To pay tribute to Greg Brandt who passed away from natural causes on January 2, 2023.

Background: Greg Brandt graduated from Hillcrest High School in 1987. He attended Brigham Young University and went on to become a very successful chemical engineer. He was a beloved husband, father, co-worker and friend.

During his high school years, Greg learned persistence and determination. He was a member of the track team and ran the 400 meters and the 4X4 relay. During his senior year, his team won the state championship in the relay. This race requires speed, but also endurance. Each year he worked hard to improve and develop his talent. He would often run uphill to his home with his heavy load of books to help build physical strength.

Greg was a hard worker.From the age of 12, he worked mowing lawns all summer with his family's lawn mowing business. He would push a manual mower in the hot sun five days a week for 8 hours a day. Their main clients were large apartment and condominium complexes. He built physical strength doing this job that helped with his running, but also mental strength to work until a job was completed even if it was unpleasant.

Greg was a disciplined student with a special gift for math. He got a perfect math score on the ACT. He was able to see the solutions to math problems in his head which helped him develop pharmaceutical machines that helped bless many lives. His co-workers said He was a genius and irreplaceable. He enjoyed using his talents to serve and help others.

Greg achieved the rank of Eagle Scout in the Boy Scouts of America program. He spent hours learning new skills as he achieved different merit badges. He enjoyed camping and canoeing. Achieving this award taught him the importance of setting goals and working with others. This program led him to a lifetime of serving in the community and his church.

Above all, Greg was a kind person who liked to quietly help people. He would find joy in knowing this scholarship will help someone pursue their educational goals.
