GREGORY B. BRANDT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Overview

Purpose: To pay tribute to Greg Brandt who passed away from natural causes on January 2, 2023.

Background: Greg Brandt graduated from Hillcrest High School in 1987. He attended Brigham Young University and went on to become a very successful chemical engineer. He was a beloved husband, father, co-worker and friend.

During his high school years, Greg learned persistence and determination. He was a member of the track team and ran the 400 meters and the 4X4 relay. During his senior year, his team won the state championship in the relay. This race requires speed, but also endurance. Each year he worked hard to improve and develop his talent. He would often run uphill to his home with his heavy load of books to help build physical strength.

Greg was a hard worker. From the age of 12, he worked mowing lawns all summer with his family's lawn mowing business. He would push a manual mower in the hot sun five days a week for 8 hours a day. Their main clients were large apartment and condominium complexes. He built physical strength doing this job that helped with his running, but also mental strength to work until a job was completed even if it was unpleasant.

Greg was a disciplined student with a special gift for math. He got a perfect math score on the ACT. He was able to see the solutions to math problems in his head which helped him develop pharmaceutical machines that helped bless many lives. His co-workers said He was a genius and irreplaceable. He enjoyed using his talents to serve and help others.

Greg achieved the rank of Eagle Scout in the Boy Scouts of America program. He spent hours learning new skills as he achieved different merit badges. He enjoyed camping and canoeing. Achieving this award taught him the importance of setting goals and working with others. This program led him to a lifetime of serving in the community and his church.

Above all, Greg was a kind person who liked to quietly help people. He would find joy in knowing this scholarship will help someone pursue their educational goals.

The student will be awarded a one-time scholarship of \$1000.00 to be paid to the college or university of the recipient's choice

Qualifications: High School Senior, 3.0 GPA or higher

Deadline: April 25, 2025

To apply:

- submit a typewritten essay of at least 500 words, but no more than 2 pages (12 point font, 1 inch margins) describing an experience where you exhibited one or more of the following characteristics: hard work, persistence, determination, team work, or caring/serving others.
- Official transcript
- Please include 1 letter of recommendation – other than a relative.

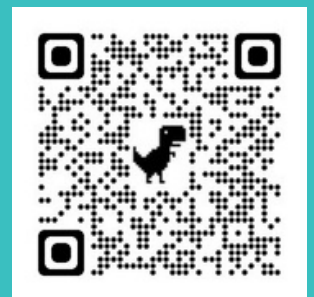

SLCC CE TRANSITION SCHOLARSHIP

Did you know that Salt Lake Community College offers qualifying SLCC concurrent enrollment students a \$1000-1500 scholarship for the first two semesters at SLCC after high school graduation? Here is how you qualify:

Step 1 – Complete a Minimum of 6 SLCC Concurrent Enrollment Credits

Six credits is approximately 2 concurrent enrollment classes, depending on the class. The classes must be SLCC concurrent enrollment classes and not concurrent enrollment classes from other Utah colleges or universities.

Step 2 - Do Well in Those Classes

You need to earn a 2.0 GPA or better after taking two or more SLCC CE classes. If your GPA is below that, and it's not the last semester of your 12th grade year, you can always take another SLCC concurrent class, perform well in that class, and improve your GPA.

Step 3 - Complete the Admission Update Form

To be eligible for the scholarship you need to change your status from a concurrent enrollment student to a traditional college student. You can find instructions on how to do that at the top of the [SLCC forms page](#). Make sure when you update your admissions application you select the fall term after high school graduation and this will not impact your CE status or CE scholarship awarding.

Step 4 - Apply for Federal Financial Aid

Follow the steps on the [Financial Aid](#) website to apply for federal financial aid via the FAFSA

Step 5 - Register for Classes

Students who register for 6 or more credits their first semester after high school graduation will automatically receive a full tuition scholarship for their first two semesters at SLCC. CE Transition Scholarship recipients will need to continue taking at least 6 credits each semester and maintain a 2.0 GPA for the two consecutive semesters the scholarship has been awarded in order to continue receiving the scholarship each semester.

Bruin Dream SCHOLARSHIP

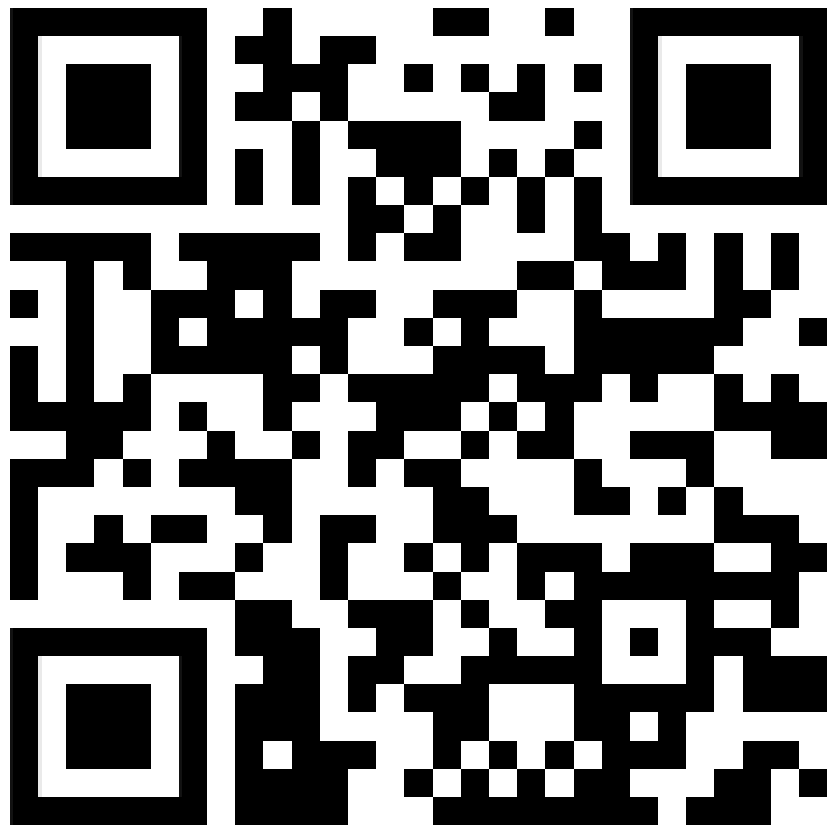
Bruin Dreams is a privately funded scholarship established to support students who frequently encounter significant obstacles to pursuing higher education due to challenges stemming from their experience relocating to a new country.

- Earn or maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5. A GPA is not required to apply for the scholarship.
- Participate in the Bruin Dreams Mentorship Program. There are multiple requirements that must be met within the mentorship program to remain eligible for Bruin Dreams for future semesters.
 - You will be paired with a mentor who may be a part of our committee, United for Resilient Communities, is a staff and/or faculty member, or is a peer mentor at SLCC.
