Senior Year Timeline to College Readiness

Take or retake the ACT or SAT

While there is a cost associated with taking the ACT or SAT multiple times, a higher score can enhance your eligibility for academic scholarships. Some private scholarships may also require test scores.

File the FAFSA*

(FreeApplicationforFederalStudent Aid)

The FAFSA is the #1 place to get financial aid for college. Even if you feel like you wouldn't be eligible, apply, it's free! *Many scholarships and some colleges require it to be completed. The provides: Grants: money for eligible students. Loans: borrowed money for all students. **Work-Study**: funding for a campusaffiliated part-time job for eligible students.

Don'thave an SSN? Youmay still qualify for in-state tuition, waivers, and private scholarships. Contact the scholarship, financial aid, or international offices at the colleges you're interested in to learn more. You can also talk to your school counselor to help explore your options.



Accept financial aid offers

If you filed the FAFSA and/or applied for scholarships, expect a financial aid offer by spring. This offer may include scholarships, grants, loans, and work- study. Ask the college or your school counselor how to accept your offer. *Some students may need to submit additional documents to the college to verify FAFSA info. Follow the college's instructions.

Stay focused.
Check in with your counselor and/or college access adviser about your plan for college and career readiness.
Ask for letters of recommendation. Some colleges (and scholarships) require one or more letters of recommendation. Connect with teachers and counselors early in the fall of your senior year.
Stay on track to complete a certificate program at your local technical college either before high school graduation or the summer after. Remember these programs are tuition free to high school students.
Apply to college in the fall.
Apply to colleges during the fall of your senior year. Participate in Utah College Application Week at your school. Ask your counselor for more information.
Apply to more than one college so you can compare the colleges' financial aid offers as well as their class size, location, programs, and more. For help comparing colleges, see the Facts at a Glance at ktsutah.org . Check with the colleges you're applying to and see what ACT scores you should be aiming for. Some colleges are test optional. If you want to improve your score, study, study, and retake the ACT the fall of your senior year. Check college admissions deadlines to make sure your new ACT scores will be ready in time.
If you haven't already, create a Keys to Success login at ktsutah.org to explore your two year, four year and technical college options.

Fill out your FAFSA.

- Complete your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as early as October at studentaid.gov.
 ** Even if you don't think you will qualify for federal grants, you should still fill out the FAFSA. The State of Utah and many colleges require it for scholarships and other aid. **
 Get help completing your FAFSA by attending a FAFSA Completion Open House during the school year. Check with your counselor to find an event at your school or nearby.
- If you are a student with undocumented citizenship status, see what scholarship options might be available for you at **educate-utah.org** and review the qualifications for in-state tuition through the HB 144 affidavit on pg. 36.



Continue applying for scholarships.

- Research what scholarships are offered by the colleges you've applied to and check deadlines.
- Learn about scholarships offered by the State of Utah on ktsutah.org.
- Apply for as many scholarships as you can during your senior year. Use the resources at **ktsutah.org** to help you find scholarships.

Check on campus resources and services.

- If you have an IEP/504 or a disability that will need accommodation, start making arrangements now by contacting colleges' disabilities resource centers.
- Visit with college student success centers to learn about scholarships, tutoring, events, and more.

Narrow it down.

- Visit the websites or call any colleges you've been accepted to and ask about their first-year experience programs and summer bridge programs.
- Send in your final high school transcripts to your college once you graduate.
- Be sure to accept any financial aid you might have received. Talk with your college's financial aid office to make sure you're good to go.

Be proud. Celebrate!

Participate in your school's College Decision Day activities to celebrate your accomplishments. Ask your counselor for more information.

Take math during your senior year.

Be sure to take the right math for your future career. Use the guide on pg. 9 to help you figure out which math class is right for you.

- Free and Accessible: The ASVAB Career Exploration Program is offered at no cost to schools and students, making it an accessible tool for career planning.
- **No Obligation to Enlist:** Taking the ASVAB does not commit you to joining the military. You can opt-in or out of having your scores released to recruiters through school-selected options.
- **Military Eligibility:** For those interested in the armed forces, the ASVAB is a mandatory test to assess eligibility and determine the jobs and training programs you qualify for.
- **Skill Assessment and Development:** The ASVAB measures aptitude, which means it assesses not only your current knowledge but also your potential to develop skills in various areas like science, electronics, and mechanical principles.
- Scholarship and Educational Guidance: Your ASVAB scores can provide valuable data for career planning, helping you make informed decisions about college and work-based learning opportunities.
- Job Opportunities: Beyond the military, the ASVAB results can help you connect with job placement programs and resources tailored to your skills

What's needed to create a StudentAid.Gov account?

Account usernames and passwords are required for the student and each parent.

Name: Fulllegal nameas itappears on your Social Security card.

Date of Birth

Social Security Number: Required for those with an SSN. Not required for parents without one.

Email: Must be verified. Use a non-school email. Students will need access to this email throughout college. **Mobile Phone/Authenticator App**: Optional to download but can be used for login, account recovery, and enhanced security.

Who NEEDS to create a StudentAid.Gov account?

- Students seekingfinancialaid.
- Biological or adoptive parents of dependent students (with or without a Social Security Number). If parents are divorced or separated, only the parent who provides the majority of financial support to the student will need a StudentAid.Gov account. If that parent is remarried, the stepparent may need one, too.
- •Student's spouse, if applicable.

Who should NOT create a StudentAid.Gov account?

- × Parentswhoalready have a StudentAid.Govaccount (parentscannotcreate a new one).
- × Students withouta Social Security Number. Cannot file the FAFSA. Please consult a school counseloror college adviser for alternative ways to pay for college, scholarship opportunities, and info on HB 144.
- × Grandparents, foster parents, legal guardians
- × Siblings
- × Aunts, uncles, cousins, etc.

How do I know if my parents need to create an account? What if my parents aren't a part of my life? If <u>students</u> can answer YES to any of the following questions, they do NOT need parental accounts.

- Will you be 24 years of age or older asof Jan 2025, OR are you married butnot separated ordivorced?
- Do you have a child or another dependent to whom you provide the majority of financial support?
- Are you currently on active duty, OR are you a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces?
- •At any time since you turned 13, were you an orphan, in foster care, or a ward of the court?
- Are or were you ever a legally emancipated minor, as determined by a court?
- Do you have a court-ordered legal guardian who is not your biological or adoptive parent?
- Are you unaccompanied AND either homeless OR self-supporting and at risk of being homeless?
- Do you have an unusual circumstance that prevents you from contacting your parent(s)? Ask for more details.

Important Warning

The StudentAid.Gov website times out if you're inactive for a short period. You must complete the setup in one session or start over.

Experiencing issues or already have an account and can't log in?

If you have trouble accessing your account or need assistance, call Federal Student Aid at 1-800-433-3243.

Finished?

Don't forget to save your backup code! With newly implemented instant identity verification, you can go straight into completing the FAFSA. It is still recommended that students & contributors create an account early to ensure all information is available. Keep your account information handy for the FAFSA each year. Take a picture or keep it in your wallet.

Getting Started

1. School counseling or guidance office

- School counseling or guidance offices are a great resource for students with scholarship questions.
- Set up a meeting and prepare questions.
- Apply to as many scholarships as possible.

2. Apply through the college or university for

 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ Many Utah colleges offer automatic scholarship opportunities when students apply.
 - Some colleges require separate scholarship applications.
- Departmental scholarships
- Leadership scholarships
- Private scholarships

3. Explore employer-sponsored tuition

- Tuition reduction
 - Employee benefits that provide reduced tuition.
 Tuition reimbursement
 - Employee benefits that reimburse employees for tuition costs.
- Employee scholarships
- Both parent and student employers may offer these benefits.

4. Community scholarships

- Many community organizations and local businesses provide scholarship opportunities.
- O Inquire at your credit union.
- O Check with local businesses.
- O Ask community organizations.
- Local scholarships can increase the chances of earning an award.
- Applying for scholarships with \$250-\$1,000 awards can add up and reduce out-of-pocket-costs.

5. Search for scholarships online

 An online search for scholarships can go a long way. Be cautious of scams and fraudulent applications. Never pay to apply for a scholarship. If a website seems suspicious, leave it, and visit an official site instead.

6. File the FAFSA

- Although the FAFSA doesn't directly provide scholarships, completing it may be required to qualify for some scholarships.
- Many scholarships that require the FAFSA are based on financial need, but there are exceptions:
 - o For example, the Opportunity Scholarship is meritbased and requires the FAFSA to be completed.


