Important Deadlines

U OF U

- Utah Direct program, guaranteed admissions,
- **Unweighted 3.5 GPA** or higher in Canyons District.
- Students still **MUST** apply in order to be accepted and be able to enroll.
- The QR Code on the letter takes the student to the U's Beehive Application.
- Once the U receives the student's application and transcripts, they will receive guaranteed admission.
- The priority deadline is **December 1, 2025**. In order to be considered for merit scholarships, students must meet that December 1 deadline.

BYU

- BYU's priority application deadline is **November 3rd, 2025**.
- **Final Admissions and Scholarship Deadline: Dec 15th**
- Please get started on this application if you haven't already – the application is lengthy and has several required supplemental materials as part of the application.

USU

December 1st

StudentAid.Gov Account Setup

To create a Federal Student Aid account, visit: studentaid.gov/fsa-id



What's needed to create a StudentAid.Gov account?

Account usernames and passwords are required for the student and each parent.

Name: Full legal name as it appears on your Social Security card.

Date of Birth

Social Security Number: Required for those with an SSN. Not required for parents without one.

Email: Must be verified. Use a non-school email. Students will need access to this email throughout college.

Mobile Phone/Authenticator App: Optional to download but can be used for login, account recovery, and enhanced security.

Who NEEDS to create a StudentAid.Gov account?

- **Students** seeking financial aid.
- **Biological or adoptive parents of dependent students** (with or without a Social Security Number). *If parents are divorced or separated, only the parent who provides the majority of financial support to the student will need a StudentAid.Gov account. If that parent is remarried, the stepparent may need one, too.*
- **Student's spouse**, if applicable.

Who should NOT create a StudentAid.Gov account?

- × **Parents who already have a StudentAid.Gov account** (parents cannot create a new one).
- × **Students without a Social Security Number.** *Cannot file the FAFSA. Please consult a school counselor or college adviser for alternative ways to pay for college, scholarship opportunities, and info on HB 144.*
- × **Grandparents, foster parents, legal guardians**
- × **Siblings**
- × **Aunts, uncles, cousins, etc.**

How do I know if my parents need to create an account? What if my parents aren't a part of my life?

If students can answer YES to any of the following questions, they do NOT need parental accounts.

- Will you be 24 years of age or older as of Jan 2025, OR are you married but not separated or divorced?
- Do you have a child or another dependent to whom you provide the majority of financial support?
- Are you currently on active duty, OR are you a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces?
- At any time since you turned 13, were you an orphan, in foster care, or a ward of the court?
- Are or were you ever a legally emancipated minor, as determined by a court?
- Do you have a court-ordered legal guardian who is not your biological or adoptive parent?
- Are you unaccompanied AND either homeless OR self-supporting and at risk of being homeless?
- Do you have an unusual circumstance that prevents you from contacting your parent(s)? Ask for more details.

Important Warning

The StudentAid.Gov website times out if you're inactive for a short period. You must complete the setup in one session or start over.

Experiencing issues or already have an account and can't log in?

If you have trouble accessing your account or need assistance, call Federal Student Aid at 1-800-433-3243.

Finished?

Don't forget to save your backup code!

With newly implemented instant identity verification, you can go straight into completing the FAFSA.

It is still recommended that students & contributors create an account early to ensure all information is available.

Keep your account information handy for the FAFSA each year. Take a picture or keep it in your wallet.

REQUIREMENTS

- Earn a 3.3 cumulative high school GPA
- Complete 3 advanced courses (see next question for more details about eligible courses)
- Complete 1 Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), or Concurrent Enrollment (CE) course in each of the core areas of high school graduation:
 - Math,
 - Science, and
 - Language Arts
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Graduate from a Utah high school

Scholarship application opens: January 5th 2026

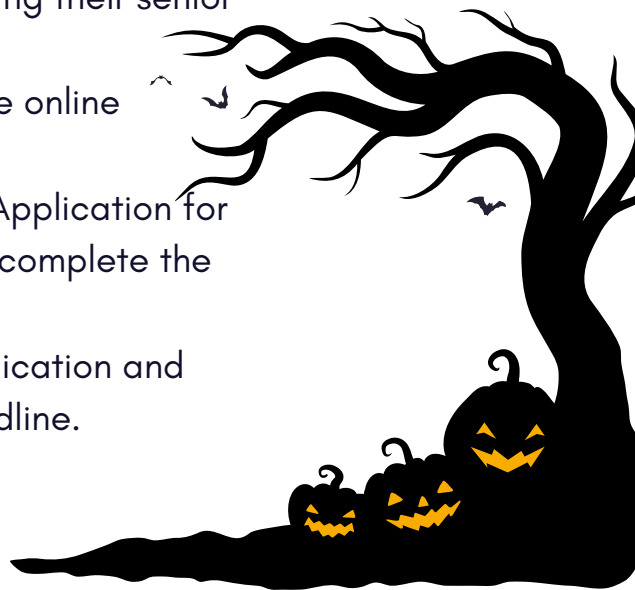
Priority deadline: January 23rd 2026

Final deadline: March 20th 2026

How to Apply

Students must apply for the Opportunity Scholarship during their senior year of high school by completing the following steps.

1. Submit the Online Application: Fill out and submit the online scholarship application to be considered.
2. Complete the FAFSA: Make sure to submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). 2025 applicants must complete the 2025/26 FAFSA.
3. Meet the Deadlines: Both the online scholarship application and FAFSA must be submitted by the priority or final deadline.






Promise Scholarship

Utah Promise ensures full coverage of tuition and mandatory fees with scholarship and grant funding for Utah resident undergraduate students whose family household income and assets are each less than \$100,000 per year.

REQUIREMENTS

- 
- Be a Utah resident
 - Be a first-time, first-year student
 - Have an unweighted high school GPA of 3.5 or above
 - Have an annual family income and assets each totaling less than \$100,000 as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
 - Must complete their university admissions application by the December 1 priority deadline
 - Must complete and submit the FAFSA by the February 1 priority deadline (University of Utah School Code is 003675)

How to Apply

- Step 1: Apply
 - Submit your University of Utah application and any supporting documents by the December 1 deadline.
 - Step 2: Submit your FAFSA
 - Complete the FAFSA by the February 1 priority deadline.
 - Step 3: Admission
 - Wait to be admitted and receive your letter of acceptance.
 - Step 4: Notice of Eligibility
 - The U will contact you regarding potential eligibility for the scholarship.
 - Step 5: Confirm Enrollment
 - Complete enrollment at the University of Utah.
 - Step 6: Attend the U
 - Attend classes and begin your education.

For Utah Scholarship

The For Utah Scholarship program ensures **four years** of tuition and fees are covered by grant and scholarship assistance for Utah residents who are eligible for the Pell Grant.

WHO QUALIFIES:

- Utah resident
- First-time freshmen
- High school GPA of 3.2 or above
- Annual completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and confirmed Pell Grant eligibility



How to Apply:

- Prospective students must first submit your **University of Utah application** and any supporting documents by the **December 1** deadline.
- Students hoping to receive the For Utah scholarship must complete the **Net Price Calculator** and submit their information to the university by clicking "Save Estimate".
- Complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** by the **February 1** priority deadline in order to know by March 1 whether you are a For Utah Scholarship finalist.
- Wait to be admitted and receive your letter of acceptance.
- The U will contact you regarding potential eligibility for the scholarship.
- Complete enrollment at the University of Utah.
- Attend classes and begin your education.





First Ascent Program

The First Ascent Scholars Program cultivates, encourages, and enables academically focused students with significant financial need to attend the Eccles School and connect with the University of Utah's local and global community while reaching their full academic potential.

WHO QUALIFIES:

- Be a current Utah high school senior
- Utah residents only
- Unweighted high school GPA of 3.2 or higher
- Applied to the University of Utah by the priority deadline of Dec. 1, 2025
- Financial need is determined through the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid](#) (FAFSA). Apply for FAFSA by the University of Utah's priority deadline of Feb. 1, 2026.*
- Must be eligible for the [For Utah Scholarship](#)
- Commit to pursuing a major in Business
- Commit to maintaining academic standards according to your primary scholarship GPA

How to Apply:

- Complete online application
- Upload copy of current transcripts
- Submit essay
- Two letter of recommendation
- Proof of financial need





Jack Kent Cooke College Scholarship Program

The Cooke College Scholarship Program is an undergraduate scholarship program available to high-achieving high school seniors with financial need who seek to attend and graduate from the nation's best four-year colleges and universities.

WHO QUALIFIES:

- Senior standing - complete four years of high school in the US., a U.S. territory, or on a U.S. Military bases and plan to graduate in spring 2026.
- Fall college enrollment- intend to enroll in an accredited four year college beginning fall of 2026.
- GPA - earn minimum, cumulative GPA of 3.75 or above






The Point Foundation Flagship Scholarship

 - If previously awarded a Point Scholarship, applicants must have exited their former program with active status.
 - Must be at least a senior in high school.

Chick-Fil-A Scholarship

WHO QUALIFIES:

- Be 18 years of age by July 15, 2026.
- Currently reside* in the United States (U.S.), Puerto Rico, or Canada at time of application and award
- Be a current
 - High school senior/student in their final year of upper or higher secondary school
 - College/university Undergraduate
 - Graduate student
 - AND
 - Planning to enroll in full-time undergraduate or graduate study for the 2026-2027 academic year at an accredited two-year or four-year college or university, or vocational-technical school or CEGEP institution
 - Be involved in community service, extracurricular activities and/or a leadership role in the twelve (12) months prior to application deadline (for example, volunteering for non-profits, helping others less fortunate, tutoring/mentoring, etc.)
 - Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale (or the equivalent)
- Be willing to participate in Chick-fil-A's Scholars Program (a one-year experience of mentoring, activities, and professional development), if selected.

How to Apply:

- As part of your application, you must upload the following documents:
- Current complete transcripts of grades. Unofficial or online transcripts must display student name, school name, grades and credit hours for each course, and term in which each course was taken.
- Copy of the first two pages of your parents' (or your own if not claimed as a dependent) IRS 1040 income tax form or T-1 Canadian income tax return.
- At least one online recommendation form must be submitted on your behalf no later than November 11, 2025 at 3:00 pm central time. You are able to list up to 3 recommenders.
- Your application is not complete unless all required documents are submitted electronically.

Quick Start Guide to “Parchment.com”

CREATE A PARCHMENT ACCOUNT AND ORDER YOUR TRANSCRIPT

CREATE A PARCHMENT ACCOUNT

1. Go to the [Sign up page](#), and fill in the fields.
 - If you select that you are interested in colleges/scholarship programs discovering you, you will be asked to enter information about your academic history. [In a hurry?](#) You can come back later to add to this section.
2. Start by adding a school or organization you attend/ed.
3. Enter the name of the school you attend/ed in the search box and click **Search**.
4. When your school appears, click **Add** and then fill in the fields on the **Add Enrollment Information** page.

ORDER YOUR TRANSCRIPT

1. [Sign in to your account](#).
2. Click **Order** under the name of your school.
3. You will see two destination options. If you are sending your transcript to a school, enter the school name in the text box. If you are sending it to yourself or another individual, select the **I'm sending to myself or another individual** option.
4. Continue filling in the fields to place your order. Information on the next page tells you more about the options that you will see here.
5. On the Provide Consent page you (or your parent/guardian) authorizes Parchment to release your transcript from your school once we receive the transcript. You can sign with your mouse or finger.
6. Finally, you will make a payment (we accept Visa, Mastercard, Discover, and American Express), and you can then begin to [track your order](#).

IMPORTANT THINGS TO NOTE

Remember that your school has your transcript. If you track your order and see Order Submitted to School as your order status, please contact your school if you are concerned about a delay in processing your order.

ELECTRONIC AND PAPER TRANSCRIPTS

Sending and receiving electronic transcripts is fast, easy and secure, but we know that there may be times when you need to send paper transcripts. Since some schools in the Parchment network may only want to receive electronic transcripts, you may not be presented with a choice of delivery methods.




For electronic transcripts, the recipient will either receive an email with a link in it to access your transcript, or, if the recipient is a school that is part of our Parchment network, the electronic transcript will land in their Parchment account.



For paper transcripts, you have the option to send your transcript by USPS mail or overnight delivery. We use FedEx for overnight delivery. FedEx does not deliver on Saturdays and Sundays. Remember that your school must approve and process your order before we can send your transcript, so if you select overnight delivery, your transcript may not be delivered the next day if there is a delay with your school processing your order.

SEND YOUR TRANSCRIPT NOW OR WAIT UNTIL YOUR NEXT GRADES ARE POSTED

During your order, you will be presented with a drop-down menu where you can select if you want to wait until your next grades are in before sending your transcript.

AFTER SCHOOL CREDIT RECOVERY: IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- CREDIT RECOVERY IS A CHANCE FOR STUDENTS TO RECOVER CREDITS THEY ARE MISSING SO THEY CAN EARN THEIR DIPLOMA AND GRADUATE WITH THEIR CLASS. STUDENTS MUST COMMIT TO ATTENDING
