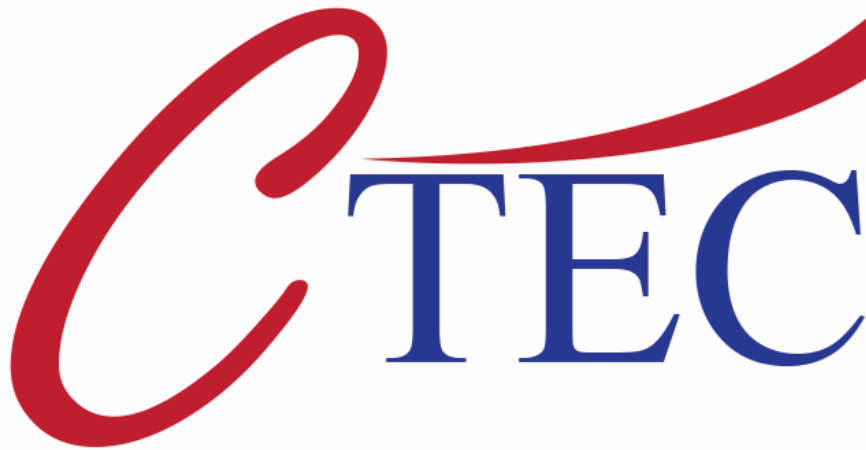

Salt Lake Community College is offering a “Concurrent Enrollment Transition Tuition Waiver”. Students must have completed at least 6 credit hours (two concurrent classes) and have a GPA of 2.0 or better in those classes. Students who register for 6 or more credits their first semester after High School graduation, will receive a full tuition scholarship for their first two semesters at SLCC. CE Transition Scholarship recipients will need to continue taking at least 6 credits each semester and maintain a 2.0 GPA for the two consecutive semesters the scholarship has been awarded in order to continue receiving the scholarship each semester.

All students will need to decide whether or not to order their AP exams by Nov 15, 2026. All students who register for their AP exam after Nov 15, 2026, will be assessed **\$40.00** exam late fee. In addition, a **\$40.00** exam cancellation fee will be assessed for any exam order canceled after Nov 15, 2026. The absolute final deadline to order an exam is March 15, 2027.

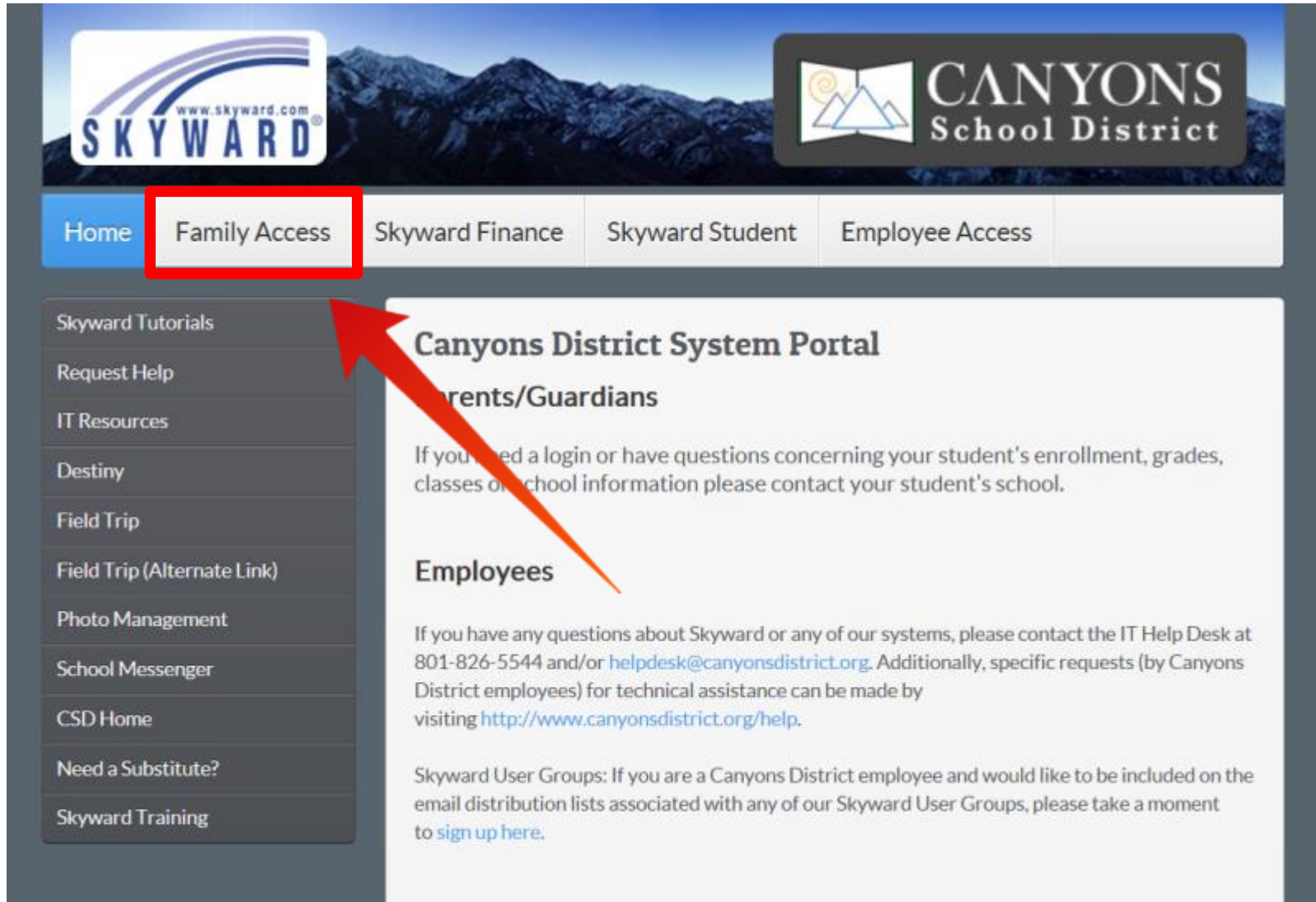
