DISTRICT SCHOLARSHIPS

Overview

The Canyons Education Foundation has five scholarships available for graduating seniors. The CANYONS STRONG scholarship will be awarded in early March and recipients recognized at our Gala on March 27.

1. Canyons Strong – Canyons Education Foundation Scholarship – \$2,500

- a. The Canyons Strong Scholarship seeks to reward a senior from each high school in the district who has financial need and has shown improvement or exemplary effort in working toward the goal of post-secondary education. We are looking for seniors that have “risen” above difficult circumstances either in family life, financially, emotionally, scholastically, etc. and are still dedicating themselves to furthering their education.
- b. Canyons Strong Scholarship award is a total of \$2,500 (\$1,000 for the first year and \$1,500 for the second year). A two-year scholarship provides incentive and encourages students to continue their education.
- c. Due date for this scholarship is February 27th, 2026

2. Aspiring Canyons Educator – ACE / \$5,000

- a. The Canyons School District Aspiring Educator Scholarship is open to any graduating Canyons School District student who will be enrolled in a University Educator Preparation program that leads to initial licensure as an elementary, secondary, or special education teacher.
- b. The scholarship may be used for tuition fees, study materials, and/or related school expenses. Scholarship amounts are determined by available funds, field of study, and critical needs areas.
- c. The scholarship may be awarded for up to four years, but the recipient must reapply and continue to meet all criteria each year.
- d. Deadline March 28th 2026.

Overview

3. Mont & Kristine Millerberg Scholarship / \$2,000 per year

- This scholarship has been established for the purpose of supporting a student who participates and is accomplished in high school and is pursuing a degree in either accounting or education.
- The award will be \$1,000 per semester/ \$2,000 total per academic year.
- The Mont and Kristine Millerberg Scholarship is renewable for recipient each semester for up to a full 4-year degree, with a maximum of \$8,000 per recipient. Renewal is dependent on maintaining 3.0 GPA and still majoring in said department.
- Deadline March 28th 2026.

4. The William E. Rappleye Draper Area Chamber of Commerce Legacy Business Scholarship / \$1,500

- The student plans on attending a four-year school, two-year school, or trade school with an emphasis on a Business Degree.
- Deadline March 28th 2026.

5. Bright Future Equity Scholarship - \$1,000

- First generation post-high school/higher education applicant.
- Refugee or immigrant to the U.S.
- A student with a documented disability.
- Deadline March 28th 2026.

OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

Overview

Requirements:

- Earn a 3.3 cumulative high school GPA
- Complete 3 advanced courses (see next question for more details about eligible courses)
- Complete 1 Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), or Concurrent Enrollment (CE) course in each of the core areas of high school graduation:
 - Math,
 - Science, and
 - Language Arts
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Graduate from a Utah high school

Dates:

- Scholarship application opens: January 5 2026
- Priority deadline: January 23rd, 2026
- Final deadline: March 20th, 2026



How to Apply:

Students must apply for the Opportunity Scholarship during their senior year of high school by completing the following steps.

- Submit the Online Application: Fill out and submit the online scholarship application to be considered.
- Complete the FAFSA: Make sure to submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). 2026 applicants must complete the 2026/27 FAFSA.
- Meet the Deadlines: Both the online scholarship application and FAFSA must be submitted by the priority or final deadline.

UTAH PROMISE GRANT

Overview

The Utah Promise Grant is a statewide scholarship program that expands access to higher education opportunities to all Utahns by providing financial assistance to students who demonstrate financial need.

FIRST CREDENTIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Overview

- Application period: Students apply during their senior year of high school.
- Students must complete a two-part application to be eligible.

Part 1 of the application will be available from January 5, 2026, to March 20, 2026.

- All 2026 applicants will receive an application update via email by May 1, 2026. If you do not receive that email by May 1, 2026, contact the scholarship office immediately, as notifications are time-sensitive.

Part 2 of the application will be available May 1, 2026, or when notifications are sent—due July 1, 2026.

- All eligible applicants are required to complete part 2 of the application to accept and remain eligible for the scholarship. The email applicants receive in May will have more details.



Eligibility Requirements:

- Complete a 2026–27 [FAFSA](#)(opens in new tab).
- Complete one of the following experiences in high school:
 - [5 general education concurrent enrollment courses](#)(opens in new tab). (each in a different GE category), OR
 - At least 6 courses, or 300 hours, in a CTE program at a Utah technical college, OR
 - 300 hours towards the completion of an approved youth apprenticeship
- Meet all application deadlines
- Enroll at an eligible Utah institution OR submit documentation of an approved deferral from an eligible institution starting the fall after high school graduation

* The requirements for a First Credential are determined and verified by the Utah State Board of Education, which reviews completion of the required coursework. Students do not need a physical or digital certificate to submit an application or be eligible, like in previous years. Please get in touch with your high school counselor for more information about completing the required courses.

CTE SCHOLARSHIP

Overview

The Career and Technical Education (CTE) Scholarships and Tuition Awards are for outstanding CTE students in Utah. The scholarships/awards are sponsored by the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) with funds provided by participating higher education institutions. The award amount varies by institution. - ☐ Commitment to educational success as reflected by GPA, coursework, and major selection.
- ☐ An ability to clearly communicate both verbally and in writing.

✓ Scholar Expectations:

- ☐ Meet with the CTA Scholarship Advisor two times each semester (online or in-person).
- ☐ Meet at least one time per semester with college academic advisor.
- ☐ Work or volunteer 500 hours each year, which includes paid/unpaid internships.
- ☐ Major in an approved degree (see CTA Approved Majors).
- ☐ Participate in CTA scholarship events.
- ☐ Send semester grade report to CTA Scholarship Advisor.

Qualifications

1. Dreamers (Undocumented) students with or without DACA or TPS who came to the U.S. before November 1, 2020, and have continuously lived in the United States since then;
2. Students are not eligible to apply for FAFSA;
3. Came to the United States before the age of 16
4. Have significant unmet financial need;
5. Have graduated or will graduate from a Utah high school (or have earned or will earn a Utah high school equivalency diploma) before Fall (August) 2026;
6. Graduated or will graduate with a Utah high school GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale or have a cumulative college GPA of 2.5 or better.
7. Intend to enroll full-time in an associate or bachelor's degree program at Weber State University in the Fall of 2026 or Spring of 2027 and
8. Are eligible for in-state tuition at Weber State University.

ETHICAL LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP



Overview

High school seniors committed to Weber State University submit a 500-word essay on the value of ethics in our society for a chance to win a \$1,000 scholarship (\$500 for fall semester and \$500 for spring semester). This scholarship assists these ethically-minded students with tuition, fees, book expenses, and any other approved educational costs.

The deadline for this year's applications is Friday, March 6, 2026.

- To be considered for selection as an Ethics Scholar, please submit the online application and the required documentation listed below:
- Winners will be honored and formally announced **at the Ethics Scholarship Banquet at Weber State University**. Scholarship winners and their parents will be informed before the banquet, and are strongly encouraged to attend.

First, gather the following information. If these items are not attached to your application, you may not be eligible for a scholarship.

- High school transcript including current GPA and ACT scores (unofficial copy, such as a scanned PDF is acceptable).
- Verification of high school graduation date by high school administrator, if you are a high school senior applying (e.g., brief letter from guidance counselor).
- Letter of Recommendation (this can be from a faculty member, community member, school administrator, etc.)
- Short bio about yourself (50-100 words). Be sure to include leadership and community service activities, school activities (sports, clubs, music, theatre), personal hobbies and interests, and what major(s) you are interested in.
- Professional-looking headshot
- A 500-word ethics essay, double spaced, titled and dated including your name and that of your high school. Please write on ONE of the following topics. To be eligible, you must include the following statement at the end of your essay: "I certify that I did not use Chat GPT or any artificial intelligence programs in the production of my essay."

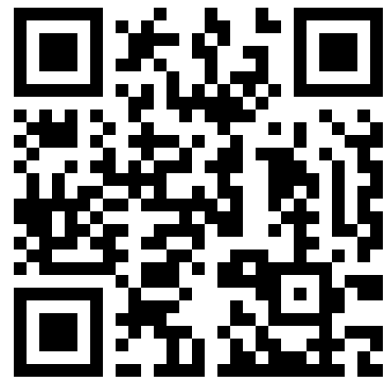
